Minutes ABMC Annual Meeting May 4, 2023

- 1. The meeting was called to order by President Liz Aghbashian at 7:03 pm.
- 2. Attendance was secured via sign-in sheet. - 3. Minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting: No report
- 4. Report of the President: Liz introduced the members of the Board. There were also reminders to clean up after the dogs at the venues and hotels!
- 5. Report of the Corresponding Secretary: No report.
- 6. Report of the Treasurer: No physical report. Complete reports are always published in The Performer.
- 7. Reports of Committees
 - 7.1 2023 National Specialty: Going great; Janet and Bonnie thanked all the Volunteers.
 - 7.2 2024 National Specialty: Lisa Knock is chair for the event to be held in Harrisonburg, VA. The tentative schedule includes 3 days of Agility; in addition to the Breed Specialties, Obedience, Rally, Herding, Scent work trials and possible tracking are planned. The Regional Specialty is scheduled for Wednesday; the National Specialty for Thursday and Agility on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. These will all be updated on the website. Members may volunteer as soon as the website is updated.
 - 7.3 ABMR: Carol Aulick presented the report. Suggestions were made to have information on the website to help people understand the Malinois breed and help avoid buying a dog that is too much for them. Suggestion was made to ask breeders what their criteria is for training; possibly send out questionnaires to breeders. As the breed continues to become more popular, the problems will probably continue for Rescue. The question is, "How can ABMC help ABMR?" ABMC can recommend breeders, trainers, etc. and encourage puppy buyers to fully research prior to purchase. Discussion was suspended. Entire report is scanned and included as an addendum.
 - 7.4 Herding report: Tasha Mesina presented. Entire report is scanned and included as an addendum.

- 7.5 Agility Teresa Kulb: suggested that in each Performer a reminder be included to encourage participants to volunteer at all agility trials. Theresa also wanted to clear up a misunderstanding regarding the awarding of the Agility HOF plaques. They are distributed at the annual banquet the year FOLLOWING the actual completion of requirements.
- 7.6 Register of Merit (ROM): It was decided in 2021 that paper copies will be eliminated and all information will be available online. Linda Friedow volunteered to scan those documents. The ROM books will be forwarded to Linda for scanning.

8. Unfinished Business

8.1 The Performer: Theresa Kulb suggested that only Championships be published rather than publishing each title earned. ADDENDUM - ABMR REPORT

ABMR Report to ABMC 2023 National Specialty Wilmington, OH

Hi, My name is Carol Aulick and I am currently serving as President for ABMR. The ABMR BOD would like to give you an update on ABMR activity in 2022.

As I think you all are aware, rescue had a devastating loss last October when our Marcia passed away suddenly. Marcia WAS rescue so her loss left us with a gaping hole that felt impossible to fill. At first, I think several of us were not sure we could go on without her but we all knew that she would want us to move ahead and carry on and in honor of all she has done for rescue, we wouldn't want to let her down.

So to start, I'd like to share how the board membership has changed.

President: Carol Aulick

Vice President: Jeanine Daugherty

Secretary: Hedy Barton

Treasurer: Linda Redfield

Directors: Julie Bear, Bonnie Bigelow, Bonnie Craig, and Lin Karrels

In addition to that organizational change, we implemented some changes in operational management by appointing several board members to be Regional Coordinator Liaisons. These liaisons are the first line of support for the coordinators in that region. Jeanine is managing the midwest region, Bonnie Craig has responsibility for the southwest, Bonnie Bigelow has the southeast, and I have the northeast.

As I'm sure you all are aware, the AKC reported that the Malinois had moved up in the popularity rankings to 32 in 2022 versus being 60th in 2014.

What we are observing is that there is an increase in the number of backyard breeders selling puppies and many are selling to families that are not aware of what they are signing up for when getting a Malinois. Education and support is generally not a part of this distribution channel. So the rise in popularity has resulted in a steady increase in owner surrenders requests and shelter requests and has pushed our rescue resources to the limit.

As in the past, our first step is to try to help with training and behavior issues. But, people have to be willing to put in the work.

We will also consider assisting with owner placement of a dog that is spayed/neutered by doing a courtesy post.

We continue to be contacted about litters almost every two weeks - pregnant dogs in shelters and back yard breeders contacting us because they cannot sell their puppies. We've also been contacted about and helped with several hoarding cases.

ADDENDUM - HERDING REPORT

The Herding Committee thanks the Board for their approval of a monthly subscription for the AKC's Herding Report for Belgian Malinois. This report lists every qualifying Malinois in the trial classees, dramatically reducing the time formerly required to extract that data from the results posted on the AKC's Event Search page. Some manually extraction from the AKC's Event Search page still remains (checking trials with 1st place Malinois to see if any were awarded HIT or RHIT, and if so, the number of competitors in the trial) and hopefully at some point the AKC's software will be reprogramed to be include that information in their herding reports. We are exploring the most efficient way to work collaboratively on the AKC Herding Rankings so that compiling this can be a shared task.

In January and February there were 57 AKC Herding trials; Malinois qualified in 10 of those trials at 4 farms in 2 states (1 in Virginia and 3 in Florida). The January – February 2023 AKC rankings have been submitted to the Performer editor and will appear in the next issue. One Malinois will be inducted tomorrow into the ABMC Herding Hall of Fame as the 25th member. An AKC Herding championship (HC) is required and the owner of the dog must be an member or have been a member of ABMC during the time the dog was being exhibited. Application for induction into the Halls of Fame can be made retroactively.
