



Information for the ABMC Scent Work trials at the World Equestrian Center – May 5 and 6 2022

Welcome to the ABMC Scent Work Trials and welcome back to everyone that has previously attended our scent work trials at WEC! We want this to be a wonderful experience for everyone attending. In addition to the information being sent out by our Trial Secretary, Andrea Ferguson, ABMC would like to provide you with some general information about our trials. We are also including a map of the WEC. Our trial this May will be held in Barn N.

Air conditioning

Barn N will be air conditioned for our trials. It will be nice and cool in there, so remember to bring a light jacket if you think you may be cold.

Crating

All crating will be in the horse stalls in Barn N and stalls have been assigned in advance by the club (see below map). Thanks so much to those of you who replied to our emails about crating and to Sara Hurst to heading up this effort. If you have a big issue, please see Trial Chair, Judy Leitzsch or Ginger Rezy at the trial.

We strongly suggest you bring a floor mat to put your crates on, if you have one. The stalls have fans and power (on the outside wall, so bring an extension cord if you will need power). If you have any questions, there will be Club members and workers on-site on the Wednesday afternoon before the trials and of course on trial days, starting at 7:00 am. You can always call me if you need help – 281-650-7683.

The building will be open for set-up on Wednesday, May 4 between the hours of 4 pm to 6 pm only. Please don't come before or after those hours. You will have access to the crating area only, not the rest of the barn.

Potty area -

The potty area will be outside and clearly sign posted. Reminder - please pick up after your dogs and make this a good experience for everyone. Previous exhibitors have been fantastic in this regard, and we thank you in advance for the same experience this May.

Trial hours -

The building will be open from 6:30 am on trial days; judge's briefing will be at 7:30 am and the trial follows.

Spectators

For your information, we have had some interest from the local community about coming out to watch our dogs work. We want to do our best to accommodate this interest in our sport. Accordingly, we plan to set up a small spectator area for some of our runs, starting after 10 am so the very Novice dogs won't have spectators. AKC encourages spectators, and we are enclosing an excerpt from the AKC Scent work Rules and Regulations about spectators and photography/recording for your information. We will make sure spectators are aware of these regulations. We thank you in advance for your patience and help with this.

Dining at the World Equestrian Center -

There are 8 restaurants located at the World Equestrian Center. Most of them offer take-out food for convenience. Please see the below link for more information.

General information -

Please know that RVs are not allowed to park during the day in the parking lot. They will need to stay in the RV lot.

There is 24/7 security monitored through cameras and security patrolling the campus.

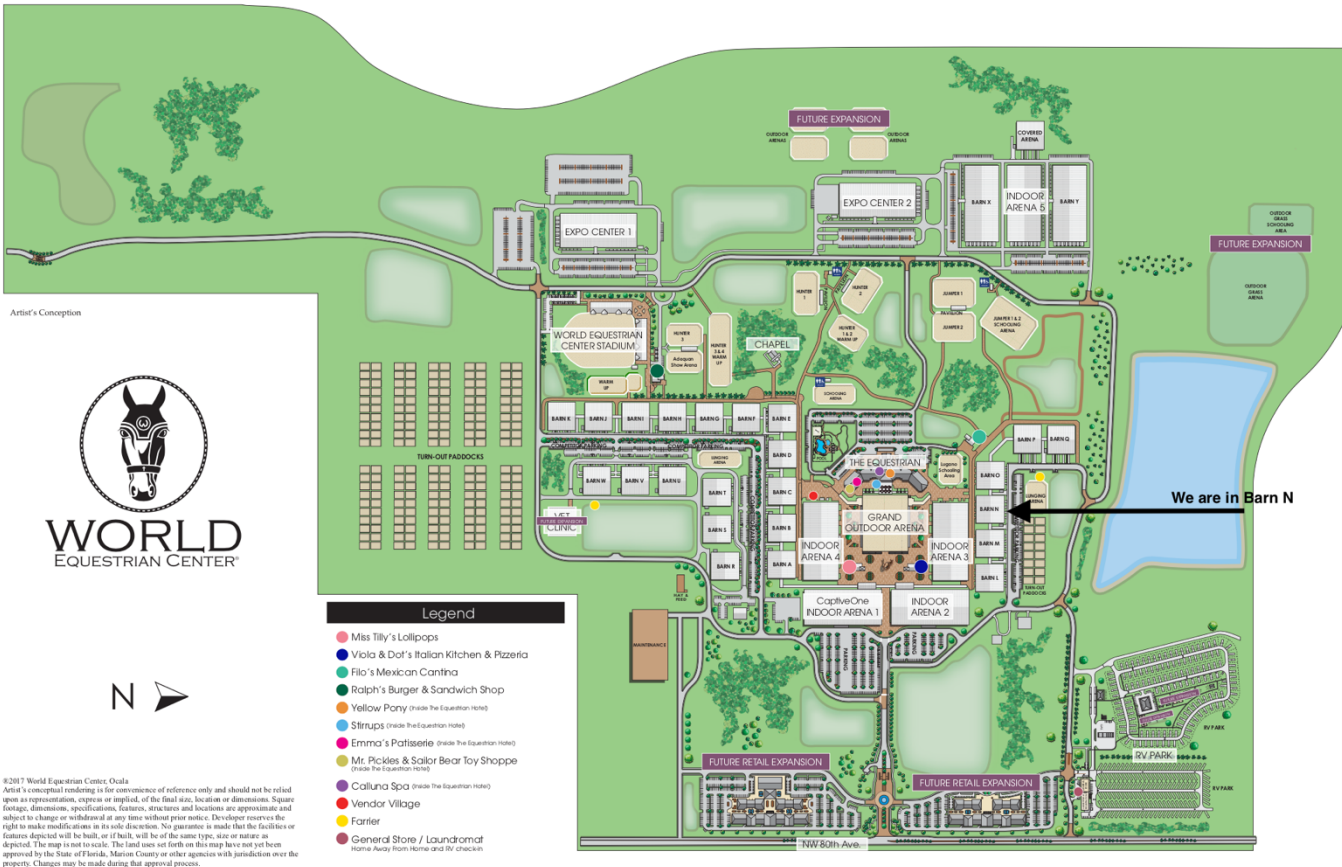

Section 36. Spectators and Double Handling. Spectators are encouraged, however, no one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators should take care to remain neutral in order to not provide clues to the handler. Judges may excuse or re-run exhibitors whose dogs they reasonably believe have benefited from double handling. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the spectator area by the judge. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their turn, except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes.

Section 37. Spectator Area. See Chapter 3, Section 32 for details on the spectator area. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in that class, may choose to watch searches from the spectator area. Spectators are absolutely forbidden from discussing details of the search with handlers who have yet to run. Even seemingly innocuous details can inadvertently aid a team's performance. The basic rule is this: *If you would not know the information but for being in the spectator area, you cannot discuss the information.*

Section 38. Photography and Recording Devices. With the permission of the dog's owner and handler, spectators are encouraged to photo and video dogs and handlers while they search, however under no circumstances may they share this with any handler competing in the same class who has not yet run. Handlers are not allowed to take video while handling a dog, except that wearable cameras such as the "Go Pro" are permitted to be worn by dogs or handlers. These videos are for the enjoyment of those who cannot be present to watch the team search, and for the handler to have a keepsake of their experience.
